

VISITOR/SUPPORT PARTNER GUIDELINES

Effective Date: June 14, 2023

General Guidelines: Applies to all visitors/support partners at all applicable locations.

Must be symptom-free. Symptoms include:

- Cough
- Fatigue
- Headache
- Sore throat
- Fever or chills
- Shortness of breath
- Muscle or body aches
- New loss of taste or smell
- Nausea or vomiting, diarrhea
- Congestion or runny nose

- ✓ Cannot have had a diagnosis of COVID19 in the last 10 days or awaiting the results of a COVID19 test (not including pre-surgical COVID19 test). Please do not enter the building if this applies to you.
- ✓ Mask must be worn by anyone with known exposure to COVID19 within the past 10 days.
- ✓ Pediatric patients – Two visitor/support partners permitted.
- ✓ Visitors under age 18 must be accompanied by an adult.
- ✓ No visitor limits for patients receiving end-of-life care (Visitation of COVID + patients will be determined on a case-by-case basis).

VISITOR RESTRICTIONS APPLY IN THE AREAS LISTED BELOW

LOCATION/SERVICE	GUIDELINE
Birth Center	During Labor: One support partner may accompany patient (leaving and re-entering is permitted). Post-Partum: Siblings can visit once daily for two hours. Two adult visitors at a time, in addition to the support partner, visiting no more than two hours per day. Sibling and adult visiting hours: Noon – 6pm.
Emergency/Urgent Care	Up to two patient support partners permitted to accompany the patient into the exam/treatment area per screening protocol.
Medical Imaging	One visitor/support partner can be permitted to escort the patient to the department and may be allowed to wait in a designated waiting area.
Surgical Associates Urology Orthopedic Associates Better Health Center Wound Care Center Rehab Services	One visitor/support partner permitted and must accompany the patient during the appointment.
